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

The patient viewing discussions will include a review and analysis of the cases moderated by a panel of expert dermatologists and dermatopathologists. STATEMENT OF NEED

Significant advances have occurred in the diagnosis and treatment of dermatological conditions. Practitioners in the field need educational opportunities to gain knowledge of recent findings and newly accepted standards related to diagnostic techniques and treatment options. By providing up to date information on the latest advances in diagnostics, therapies, and pathogenesis by those who specialize in the field, our goal is to facilitate best practices and improve current provider practices.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Identify current controversies in dermatology and how to navigate them with patients.
- Employ practical skills to improve procedural techniques and patient's outcomes in cosmetic and surgical dermatology.
- Describe and utilize recently approved therapeutics for common dermatologic conditions.
